Part 1 of the Patent Agent Skills Examination assesses the strategy- and drafting-related skills required of Patent Agents specified in the <u>College of Patent Agents and Trademark Agents Technical</u> <u>Competencies</u> document. The table below specifies the percentage of marks by area:

Test-takers have 3 hours on one day to complete the first component and 3 hours on a subsequent day to complete the second component. The 2 components are scored together as a single examination.
